#### 1. Agenda Approval

#### 2. Communications from the Public - Consent Agenda

There were no public comments.

#### 3. Approval of Consent Agenda

It was moved by Voting Member Jeff Ochs, seconded by Voting Member Teresa Ward, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

#### 4. Information and Reports

- a. **NOVA Reporting and Upcoming Deadlines** Jennifer Macarthy reminded the group that on January 31<sup>st</sup>, Q2 data will be required to be entered into TopsPro. She also noted that the Program Expenditure Data Report will be due on February 15, 2019. Jeff Ochs provided information on where to find training of the completion of this form.
- b. **Data and Accountability Funds** Jennifer Macarthy informed the consortium that she is working with Jeff Ochs on the execution of an \$80,000 contract to provide assistance with data and reporting per the request of the consortium. She also stated that she per the request of the consortium she is also working on a \$10,000. Chuck Tracy noted that the data should support assistance with training for construction. The consortium discussed the concept of coordinating in order to develop a regional adult education construction course or series of courses. The consortium members agreed to meet on February 5, 2019 at BCOE CTE Center to discuss the concept of a coordinated construction training offering in the Butte-Glenn County region.
- c. **Butte-Glenn Adult Education Consortium Three Year Plan** Jeff Ochs reported that last time the marketing video aired in the movie theaters, the cost was \$4,000, and the cost for 15-20 television commercial spots was \$1,000. Jeff also noted that he recently changed the distribution for the Oroville Adult School catalog, and now 90,000 catalogs are distributed. He offered all of

the members the opportunity to advertise specific programs in the Oroville catalog. The members will individually reach out to Jeff if they are interested in the advertising opportunity.

- d. **NOVA Reporting and Upcoming Deadlines** Jennifer Macarthy explained the current budget reporting requirements in NOVA.

#### f. Butte-Glenn Adult Education Consortium Three Year Plan

- iii. <u>Goals & Strategies</u> Jennifer informed the consortium that the goals & strategies will be developed through a roadmap process. This process began, however due to time constraints it was not completed.


